

Reading: **Ezekiel 37: 1 - 14**

Introduction - Background to Ezekiel's Vision

- The ancient nation of Israel was comprised of 12 tribes.
- During the reigns of David and Solomon, all 12 tribes were united.
- During the reign of king Rehoboam the nation split in two.
- Ten tribes to the north the 'House of Israel.'
- Two tribes to the south the 'House of Judah' or 'the Jews.'
- In 721BC 'house of Israel' taken away into exile by the Assyrians.
- In 604BC 'house of Judah' taken away into exile in Babylon for 70 years.
- It's at this time God shows Ezekiel the 'boneyard.'
- The Jews in Israel today are only descendants of the two tribed house of Judah. They are NOT all Israel.
- The Jews look forward to a future re-unification with 'the lost 10 tribes.'
- That is partly what the vision is about.

1 The Vision

- At the time of the vision all Israel is nationally dead.
- They are like a valley of dry bones.
- Ezekiel is wondering, can ALL Israel live again spiritually and nationally?
- [Vs 11] The bones are **THE WHOLE HOUSE OF ISRAEL**, not just a part.

- NB. Bones are mentioned 9 times in the text.
- Ezekiel prophesies to the bones and flesh, sinew and skin come on the bones.
- **NB.** They are just corpses no breath in them.
- [Vs 9/10] He prophesies again and breath comes into them and they come alive.
- NB. The breath of God made the difference.
- The words 'breath' or 'breaths' are used 7 times.

2 The Meaning Of The Vision

- The vision was **NOT** fulfilled when the Jews became a nation in 1948.
- Remember, the vision is to do with the whole house of Israel.
- The Jews today have definitely **NOT** experienced the breath of God.
- They still reject Christ.
- Ezekiel is shown a time when ALL Israel (the Jews and the 'lost 10 tribes') come together and God puts His Spirit in them.
- The breath coming upon them is a national revival and a great turning to Christ. [Zechariah 12:10].
- What is the 'exceedingly great army' for? Armageddon foretold in [Ezekiel 38].

3 The Breath Of God

- It is the breath of God that makes the wonderful difference.
- Consider [Genesis 2:7], [Job 33:4], [Psalm 33:6], [John 20:22], [Acts 2:4].

4 Personal Revival

- We are approaching the midnight hour in world history.
- If ever Christians and the church needed the breath of God on them it is **NOW**.
- We can't do it ourselves. We can only desire it and ask and plead with God to breath on us.

'O breath of life, come sweeping through us, revive thy church with life and power....'
